Acts 9:1-2.

- Why did Saul go to the high priest? What did he want to do?
- What is “The Way?” What does that mean? (Read John 14:6 for a hint.)

Acts 9:3-9.

- On the road to Damascus, who appeared to Saul?
- Saul thought he was punishing who? Who was Saul really persecuting?
- Imagine if you thought you were following God. Then God appeared to you and said you were really working against Him. What would you think and feel?

Acts 9:10-16.

- Jesus told Ananias to go visit Saul and heal him. What did Ananias think about that?
- Ananias didn't want to see Saul, but Jesus still told him to go. Does God tell you to do difficult things? What hard things does God tell you to do?
- How can we do those hard things?

- God had plans for Saul. God said Saul will preach the gospel to who?

Acts 9:17-22.

- Saul changed very quickly from persecutor to believer. Who made him change so quickly?
- What did the people in Damascus think about Saul become a Christian?
- God chose Saul, and it changed Saul's life. God chose you, too. How does that change your life?
